They are generous to a fault insisting that they pay for everything we do while we are their guests; they give freely of their time also, taking us to places that the normal tourist wouldn't get to see. What better way to understand a country than to spend time living with the people?

The people of Otrocineves have stayed in our homes here also. They are so easy going and love to get the true flavour of Irish living. Their young people are interested in improving their English and in learning about Irish culture. This is not like having strangers in your home; this is like having friends to stay and although there is sometimes a language barrier, sign language usually solves the problem! In fact, most of our friends have quite enough English to get by.

We would really like to bring some new blood into our group and would truly welcome anyone who wishes to find out more.
